

Power Line Safety slated for May meeting.

May's guest speaker, **Charlie Basham**, will be talking about power line safety.



Charlie Basham, N6DZW, has worked for Southern California Edison (SCE) for more than 28 years and currently serves as the manager of public safety. SCE is one of the nation's largest electric utilities, serving more than 13 million people in a 50,000 square mile service area within central, coastal and Southern California.

During his Edison tenure, Charlie has managed every aspect of the company's communications functions such as advertising, marketing, media relations, sponsorships and special projects. Charlie's also the company's historian.

As the public safety manager Charlie is targeting the high "at-risk" professions that, by the very nature of their jobs, are most in danger of coming in accidental contact with power lines. These include contractors, tree trimmers and agricultural workers. Charlie also believes this list also includes ham radio operators.

Charlie has been a ham operator for more than 40 years and holds an Extra class license. He's the immediate past president of Utility Communicators International and also served two terms as the regional president of the Public Relations Society of America .He's earned more than 100 national, regional and local awards and honors for his work. Charlie holds a master's degree in communications and frequently teaches advertising and public relations at local universities

Director, Two Years: Tom had nothing to report.

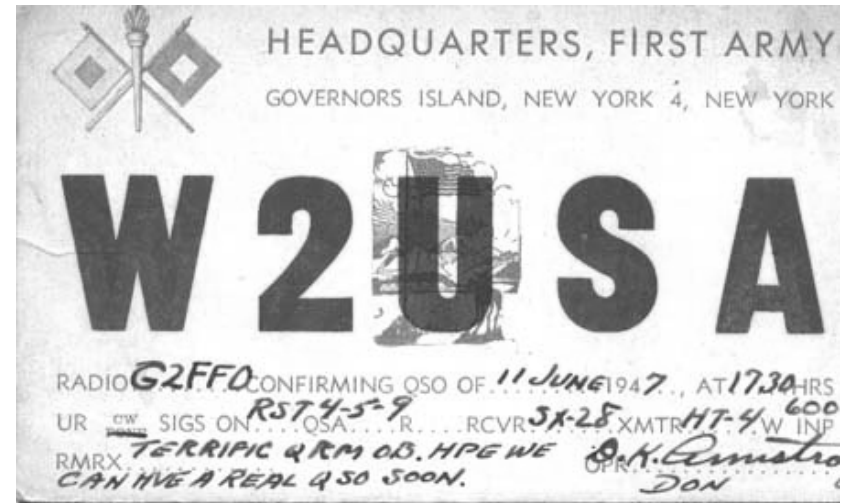
The Board Meeting minutes and the Treasurers Report, as they appeared in the last Q5, were approved.

D.A.R.C. General Meeting Minutes – April 3, 2008

Sam Lollar, K1SL, President, called the meeting to order at 1930 hrs, with 31 persons in attendance and welcomed everyone. He then led everyone in the Pledge of Allegiance. Sam introduced himself and then asked all those in attendance to each introduce themselves'.

Tom, VanBuskirk, K6TV, introduced Brian Thorson, who works for Southern California Edison whose title is Engineer, Environmental Health & Safety, and serves as the company's specialist in Electric and Magnetic Fields (EMF). Brian does not presently hold a ham license, but is studying to obtain his Technician class license. Brian began his presentation with a pitch for saving money on our power bills for those of us who have central air, and urged all that qualify to investigate the plan.

The various interference modes were discussed which include Ground Loops, Conducted, Magnetic Induction, and Radiated. Next the types of interference were discussed which include Broadband Noise, caused by switching, Narrowband Signals, caused by transmitters, data clocks, etc, Image Frequencies, which is the opposite side of a local oscillator, and Spurious Oscillations, which are spurs riding on the signal.

The major interference causes are first from Intentional Radiators such as transmitters, microware links, cell phones, Bluetooth, WIFI, and cordless devices. Then from Unintentional Radiators which are computing devices, appliances, and industrial equipment. Brian also pointed out the interference can also come from arcing insulators on high voltage distribution lines, but 75% of interference problems are within the home. Common household sources of interference are from doorbells, thermostats, dimmer switches, air purifiers, motors, circuit breakers, florescent lamps, and ignition systems. Brian finished by saying when dealing with any neighbor concerning Radio and Television Interference (RTV) to use "cookie diplomacy" to help to meet your mutual goal of finding and eliminating the problem.

The meeting was adjourned for a 10 minute break.

After the break Sam then asked for a motion to approve the Treasurer's Report as it appeared in Q5. Motion made, seconded and approved. He then asked for a motion to approve the Minutes of the last meeting as they appeared in Q5. Motion made, seconded and approved. Next Sam mentioned that club hats and shirts were available are this meeting and to see Ivan, KB6ATT if interested.

Larry Tinkler, K6LXT, finished the night by conducting the monthly raffle. The evening winners were: Frank Myers, N6ATU, a 300 watt inverter;

International Marconi Day Event Is April 26

(Apr 15, 2008) -- Special event stations will be on the air Saturday, April 26 (UTC), to mark International Marconi Day (IMD), a 24-hour Amateur Radio event commemorating the birth of wireless pioneer Guglielmo Marconi on April 25, 1874.

Participants can qualify for awards by making contacts on 160 through 10 meters (CW, SSB and digital) with designated IMD stations operating on or near a site where Marconi carried out experiments or where Marconi equipment was used prior to his death in 1937. The sponsoring Cornish Radio Amateur Club (CRAC) will operate GB4IMD from Pendennis Castle, Falmouth, Cornwall, overlooking Falmouth Harbour where Marconi spent some 10 days aboard his yacht *Elettra* in April 1923.

Additional IMD stations will be on the air from the UK, the US, Canada, South America, Australia and Europe. The IMD Web site has a list of IMD 2008 award stations. On the US side, the Marconi Cape Cod Radio Club, KM1CC, will operate participate at the Coast Guard Station on Coast Guard Beach in Eastham, Massachusetts, just south of Marconi's original 1903 station on Cape Cod. If you would like to operate an IMD 2008 award station, register your station prior to the event, providing full details.

DX NOTES by Mike Gauthier, K6ICS

May Propagation Outlook

Spring is here. Background noise is increasing. The solar cycle is at it's minimum, but there is a lot of DX to be worked. 40-20 meters are better than expected. There are sporadic daytime DX openings on the 17 through 10 meter bands. Monitor the 10 meter beacons. Best DXing will be sunrise and sunset (Grayline) ± 2 hours for most bands.

Although the actual Armed Forces Day is celebrated on May 17, the AFD Military/Amateur Crossband Communications Test will be conducted on May 10 to prevent conflict with the Dayton Hamvention, scheduled for May 16-18.

The annual celebration features traditional military to amateur crossband communications SSB voice tests and copying the Secretary of Defense message via digital modes. These tests give Amateur Radio operators and short wave listeners an opportunity to demonstrate their individual technical skills and to receive recognition from the Secretary of Defense and/or the appropriate military radio station for their proven expertise. QSL cards will be provided to those stations making contact with the military stations. Special commemorative certificates will be awarded to anyone who receives and copies the digital Armed Forces Day message from the Secretary of Defense.
