Other Board members present were Dave Buhler, WB6ZGF, VP-Service; Frank Hornberger, N6ZDS, Treasurer; Tom VanBuskirk, K6TV, Director, Two Years and Ed Roos, KC6ZHY, Director, One Year.

Also present was Ron Eveland, W6QM, Secretary-elect.

Absent were Arlene Schwartz, KE6GFI, VP-Programs; Dick Palmer, WB6JDH, VP-Membership and Paul Metzger, KQ6EH, VP-Ways and Means.

I also designated Ham Radio Outlet in Anaheim as the supplier since **Janet and Chip** (who now works for **Bob Heil**) have been so good to the Club in the past. Erik was very particular about the details of the order to make sure everything was accurate and correct. The total cost came to \$6,859.78.

On October 10, 2006, I received the news from Chief Seely that the equipment had arrived and was temporarily being stored in the EOC. Since it was the same day as the club's Board of Directors meeting, I went into the EOC and there were five big boxes; our radios had arrived! At this juncture, I must point out that we are allowed to have our Board meetings and VE testing in this facility at no cost to the Club thanks to the generosity of Chief Sauter and the Department.

But back to the equipment. The antennas and tower had not arrived but were expected by truck delivery. The next step will be my working directly with Chief Turner to designate and prepare the area in the EOC where the radio station will be located. To simplify operations and reduce the learning curve, all radios are Kenwood models. The Board of Directors of the Downey Amateur Radio Club will decide administrative and operational parameters once the station is activated.

The news of this project will come as a surprise to some, but I've made no effort to keep it a secret. I didn't want to publicize this until it was accomplished since this involved federal funding and working with several municipal departments. At any point this task could have been derailed or delayed by unforeseen obstacles

I want to thank the Downey Fire Department and its command staff, the City of Downey, the DARC Board and **Buck Kerns**, AE6DT, for his technical assistance. This has been a long and sometimes difficult road to travel and the reward will be a fully equipped amateur radio station located in the City's EOC and heightened visibility for the Club. But most importantly, it is another communications asset for use in the next disaster we all know is coming.

New EOC Equipment!

Ever since the new Emergency Operations Center was built behind Downey Fire Station #1, I have been in contact with Fire Assistant Chief **Jeff Turner** about placing new amateur radio equipment in that facility to replace the older VHF equipment housed in the station itself, as well as add HF capability. Chief Turner and Fire Chief **Mark Sauter** have been very supportive in this effort and now I can say it's becoming a reality.

Battalion Chief **Chuck Seely** is in charge of writing grant requests for the Downey Fire Department and he requested funding for this project from the federal Department of Homeland Security awhile back. Federal bureaucracy being what it is we waited for approval for some time. Finally it was approved, only to be rescinded after three days when it was noticed the equipment was to be used for communications and that particular grant had no room for such funding. We were back to square one.

With additional input from me, Chief Seely tried again and we waited again, and waited, and waited. Finally, I received the e-mail I had hoped for; the grant had been approved at a maximum funding of \$7,400! We were in business!

Next, I researched equipment, antennas and masts that would fit into the grant's parameters and leave a little left over for miscellaneous things, if necessary. Working with Erik Sund, the City's Purchasing Manager, I put

New Business:

Homeland Security Grant: Dave reported some of the radio equipment purchased with these funds has arrived with a cost of \$6,859.78 out of a total grant of \$7,400. The Board will have to decide administrative and operating parameters for the station, once it is activated.

Membership Program Chair: Ed proposed that, in addition to the VP-Membership, a membership program chair be appointed with the sole purpose of actively soliciting new members. Several methodologies were suggested including having all renewals be accompanied by a membership form so as to be sure all information is up to date. Item tabled until the next Board meeting.

Other Business:

Ed said he is volunteering to be the Club's publicity chair since a lot of what we do is not reported in the media.

Along that same line, Dave reported he has sent an item on the Club's meeting place and day/time to the Downey Patriot for inclusion in its Community Calendar section. This brought up the notice in World Radio's "Visit your local radio club" section and the need to update it. The Board decided to have Tom's name as the contact since he is the license trustee.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:33

D.A.R.C. General Meeting Minutes – October 5, 2006

Sam Lollar, K1SL, 1st Vice President, called the meeting to order at 7:30 PM with 33 persons in attendance. All present introduced themselves including guest David Kates, a USC graduate journalism student.

Dave Buhler, WB6ZGF, asked for volunteer communicators for the Holiday Lane Parade to be held on Sunday, December 3, 2006.

Arlene Schwartz, KE6GFI, VP – Programs, introduced our speaker for the evening, Bob Farrow, N6OPR, a former DARC member and officer who spoke about the 10-10 International Organization. Bob explained how it was formed (to promote the use of the 10 meter band) and the way it functions today. He recounted that there are almost 75,000 10-10 numbers assigned and there are many certificates that can be obtained as well as a convention that is held every two years. Bob spoke affectionately of the DARC, having earned his amateur radio license through the assistance of several of its members. Following his presentation, there was a brief question and answer period.

Elections for the 2006-2007 year were held. Since there was only one office with two candidates open, the remaining candidates were elected by acclimation. The contended office, Director – Two Years, had as candidates Buck Kerns, AE6DT, and John Schroeder, N6QQ. Buck was not present and John was asked to step outside while the vote was taken. By a show of hands, Buck was elected to the position. Sam asked that all present and future officers attend the Board meeting on next Tuesday evening at the City EOC behind fire station #1.

New Hams Wanted, No Experience Necessary

That should be a sign we want to hang outside of our meetings, or at Net Electronics, or wherever people with a technical mind hang out.

In case you haven't been outside of your "shack" in a while, ARRL has been pushing the "Hello" program, an effort to bring new blood (of all ages) into Amateur Radio. My brother in law just received his no code Tech license in response to CERT needs, he's now known as KI6EDL.

It's a tough sell in the age of high tech electronics, cell phones, computers and Internet connections, combined with a lack of vocational electronic classes in our local high schools and most local colleges, but there's still a place for Ham Radio, a place for people interested in communicating via radio waves.

With the advent of the No Code Technician license, easy to follow study guides and local testing by fellow Hams, its easier now than ever before to get a Ham license. The wealth of commercially built equipment in a wide range of prices means getting on the air is now a matter of studying and buying. The most popular entry level unit, the H-T, can be bought for less than \$200 now, and with the large number of repeater systems in the LA basin making that first contact is now easier than ever.

Remember, its not just about sitting at a radio making isolated contacts with other Hams sitting at their radios, its also about civic events, public service events, emergency communications, mobile radio, outdoor activities and wherever else you can get a signal on the air!

When somebody asks you who you are talking to on your "CB", take some time and explain to them its much more than a CB, its Ham Radio.
